Readers of the Chronicles will know from the last edition that we are upgrading the look (curbs, gutters, vegetation, street furniture) at the corner of 48 Avenue and 53 Street. You may be wondering why the project "stalled". The reason is that the contractor encountered hydrocarbon contaminated soil while replacing the water and sewer lines that are below that intersection. We have removed the contaminated soil and are waiting for Alberta Environment's approval before we complete the surface work in case we need to do any further remediation underground. We expect that approval very shortly. And where did the contamination come from, you ask? We are not certain but we suspect it was from an old gas station that used to be on the corner near that intersection.

Kinsmen Free Swims



BEYOND THE POLITICS!

OFF THE CUFFS

It was Tuesday July 30 at 1 PM - who noticed? Not too many heard the electronic beep, buzz or whirr that established a link between the Taber 9-1-1 Dispatch Centre and the City of Calgary Public Safety Communications Centre. This link will now handle the transfer of medical emergency ambulance calls for Taber and

district to Calgary. Calgary will now take the information and send an ambulance. This writing is not to lament the mind numbing politics that lead to this change more than enough has already been said and we now know that indeed public safety can be trumped. This is about a tribute to what was our own local lifeblood connection to medical services and the people who cared and made it work.

At 5700 50 Avenue for 24 hours a day 365 days of the year a well-trained and dedicated Dispatcher takes calls and dispatches the police, fire and ambulance. That same Dispatcher then supports and coordinates an emergency response providing information on how to get there, whose there, what to anticipate, updates as the situation changes, ensures crucial information is passed to doctors, tow truck personnel, the gas company and beyond. The Dispatcher is sitting in front of nine monitor screens, handling two 9-1-1 lines, five other incoming lines and three radio channels while orchestrating several ambulance attendants, fire fighters and police; this is the daily pace at the dispatch centre.

Who are the people who do this job? Who do you know who in the normal course of a day can be abused by an angry drunk, deal with the panic of a house on fire or hear the last breath of a caller who did not make it. Who do you know who was part of bringing a new life into the world, saved a life by talking a person through life saving CPR or shared in the success of apprehending someone desperate to escape the law. I know these people, I respect these people, I love these people, and now these people have said a sad farewell to a challenging and yet gratifying aspect of their jobs.

Take heart, Dana, Lindsey, Sandra, Linda, Leah, Janet, Stacey and Tim. Your medical dispatch service to this community lives on in the health and strength of those who owe their very lives to what you do.
