AND WHEREAS pursuant to the provisions of the *Municipal Government Act*, RSA 2000, c. M-26, as amended, the TOWN OF TABER has the authority to acquire easement and right-of-way with respect to the Lands by expropriation;

AND WHEREAS the TOWN OF TABER deems it to be in the public interest and good that the said easement and right-of-way be acquired by expropriation;

AND WHEREAS the TOWN OF TABER is desirous of acquiring the said easement and right-of-way pursuant to the provisions of the *Expropriation Act*, RSA 2000, c. E-13, as amended;

## NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

 THAT the proceedings shall be commenced by the TOWN OF TABER, its servants, officers or agents to expropriate and easement and right-of-way in the Lands.

2) That the terms of the easement and right-ofway shall be as follows:

> The registered owner of the Lands shall be the Grantor and the TOWN OF TABER shall be the Grantee. The TOWN OF TABER as Grantee shall have the following rights:

- a) The right to enter into and on the Lands for any purpose relating to the easement and right-of-way;
- b) The right to lay down, install, construct, operate, inspect, maintain, repair, replace, alter, remove and reconstruct from time to time water and/or sanitary pipelines including accessories and appurtenances within the ROW Area;
- The right for workers and any other persons to enter upon and access the Lands for any purpose related to the easement and right-of-way;
- d) The right to have any necessary equipment and vehicles enter onto and access the Lands for any purpose related to the easement and right-of-way;

- e) the right to occupy and utilize as a temporary working space an additional portion of the Lands, not exceeding an additional fifteen meters (15 m) in perpendicular width and parallel to the ROW Area, in relation to conduct and completion of any or all of the foregoing; and
- f) the right to register the easement and right-of-way at the appropriate Land Titles Office.
- 3) THAT the officers, servants or agents of the TOWN OF TABER and the solicitors for the TOWN OF TABER be, and are hereby authorized and directed to do all things necessary to initiate, carry out and conclude the expropriation proceedings under the provisions of the Expropriation Act, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sign, seal, serve and publish the necessary documents to initiate, proceed with and conclude the said expropriation, as applicable.
