## A) Firemen's Bonspiel

Steve Swarbrick from the Taber Firefighters Association was present to report and answer questions regarding their request for support for their upcoming Provincial Bonspiel to be held January 26-29, 2022 in Taber and Vauxhall. This bonspiel is expected to host 24-30 teams and spectators and is being held in the south for the first time in 45 years. The Taber Curling / Vauxhall Curling Clubs are excited to host this event. Originally the committee had planned to use the small ice arena for 2 sheets of ice and has recently decided to support another curling club instead.

S. Swarbrick reported that the budget for this event is around \$30 000, with much of the incoming funds being from the entry fees, sponsorship, and the Alberta & Canadian Firefighter Curling Associations. At this time, the host committee is asking the Town of Taber for \$5000.00 funding to help offset some of the event expenditures (which includes rentals, meals, prizes, etc). There will be raffles throughout the event where the proceeds typically go to Multiple Dystrophy (official charity for the National Firefighters). The committee is hoping the make this event a great success, especially coming off the COVID missed year.

The Board members thanked the Firefighters for their time, and dedication to this worthy event.

### **ACTION ITEMS**

## A) Taber Mixed Slow-Pitch

The Taber Mixed Slow-Pitch has sent a letter to the Town of Taber Council asking for a reduction in League fees for the 2021 Season. Their season typically starts in mid April and ends the first week in August, however this year due to COVID restrictions they were not able to start until June 10<sup>th</sup> and chose to not extend their season as some other user groups decided. Their Adult League Fee is \$703.00/team and they were at about ½ the teams this year with 7 teams. League fees include all scheduled games, and all the practice times that each team chooses to book through the town.

Many board members expressed the fees were still very reasonable per player for the 8 weeks of play (which had no weather cancelations) and it was reported that the organizers collected enough to pay for all expenses and there would have been no losses. Many of the members were reluctant to support subsidization of adult recreation, felt this would open up having to support all adult users, and suggested the group could apply for COVID subsidy.

## B) Information for the Recreation Board

K. Ostrup reviewed each line in this item with the Board. There has been a lot happening within the department since the last meeting, however the summer events, programs, and projects have all been very successful. The Board Members congratulated Kory Ostrup on her new management position within the organization and stated it's well deserved.

The Board Members were encouraged to ask about any other recreation topics they may have at this time. There was a question about where the sign project is at for the trail system, which was supposed to go to the Intermunicipal meeting and has not yet been discussed. K. Ostrup reported that the recording secretary had it on the agenda for the next meeting, however was unsure if the Town/MD of Taber have met since this was discussed and agreed to look into the item once again. The Chairperson would like to once again open discussions for a shared Municipal Recreation Master Plan, which was previously tabled until the MD of Taber had their own document completed which is now available. K. Ostrup agreed to have this item on the next agenda for the Recreation Board to discuss.

## Background:

At the September 9, 2021 regular meeting of the Recreation Board, Chairperson Hansen requested this agenda item be brought to this meeting.

In 2019 the Town of Taber approached a few of the surrounding municipalities proposing to collaborate to have a Regional Recreation Master Plan created and at the time this project was not supported. The town proceeded and created its own Recreation Master Plan. Chairperson Hansen is requesting discussion as to whether it's worth revisiting the creation of a regional shared document.

Here are a few points Administration thoughts to share:

- 1. The Town of Taber 2019 Recreation Master Plan cost \$20,000.00.
- 2. The MD of Taber also completed its own Master Plan in 2019.
- 3. Because the Town of Taber and MD of Taber often collaborate together on large projects, having representatives from both on boards/committees such as Recreation Board, and the two councils meet a few times a year to discuss areas of mutual interests, does set the Framework for Collaboration between municipalities.

- 2. At the Trout Pond July 28th, 2021, questions were asked if this was the right location and it was determined that Director of Recreation & Manager of Engineering and Public Works to meet with Willy Friesen who is the Disc Golf Co-ordinator.
- 3. When the recommendation of placing the Disc Golf Course at Ken McDonald Memorial Sports Complex. Mr. Friesen was elated stating "that is the best news ever"!
- 4. Mr. Friesen and Director of Recreation went and visited the site after the meeting.
- 5. Mr. Friesen submitted in rough draft the potential for the Disc Golf holes for the course.




- Regular, monthly facility inspections were performed
