ADOPTION OF THE MINUTES

A) Regular meeting – November 3, 2022

RES. 25/2022 MOVED by Councillor J. Sorensen that the Recreation Board adopts the Minutes of the Regular Meeting of the Recreation Board held on November 3, 2022, as presented.

DELEGATIONS

A) Amanda Malone

Amanda Malone and Eric Szigli went through a Power Point Presentation explaining the organizations they belong to; Taber Riding Group Facebook group, Southern Alberta Trail Riders Association (SATRA), and Alberta Equine Federation (AEF) and the desire for horseback riders to be able to ride in the Taber Trout Pond area once again. They were asking the Recreation Board for their support to go to Town of Taber Council to have the Bylaws changed to allow horse riding on the Trout Pond Area.

It was highlighted that the riders do not like to ride on paved paths, all riders who belong to SATRA, participate in chariot rides, rodeos, clinic, and shows are required to have liability insurance by belonging to AEF and that horses very aware of their surrounding and avoid people/animals whenever possible as they see most things as predators. There are few places to ride which are close to this area and permission to ride in the area, would have SATRA hosting biweekly Sunday rides at the very least, coordinating with other user groups to avoid conflicting events, signage (rules/etiquette, and appropriate trails) and would also need an appropriate staging area. Agriplex does work as a staging area, however it's quite a distance from the trails and they would prefer to be able to use the old rodeo grounds. It was noted that SATRA does fundraising and would be willing to help with costs of signage and trail maintenance if needed. SATRA meets monthly and does have a trail maintenance sub-committee whose focus is to organize cleanup events.

It was noted by the Board Members that mapping and signage would be key at trail heads/staging areas and possibly requiring the riders to be SATRA members to have access which would ensure they are insured and knowledgeable of the rules. The current trail users put a lot of time/money into the infrastructure and the Board Members stressed the importance of doing everything the riders can do to avoid damaging the area (by not riding when wet), and ensuring to clean up after themselves and horses. The trail users have a big volunteer group, and the Board was concerned if damage was done, they would lose the good momentum they currently have going for them. Board members stressed, for this to work, all the trail users need to work together to maintain, self-police and educate everyone of the rules/etiquette. Many agreed that the area is large and they would like to see as many different users enjoying the area safely. The Board thanked Amanda Malone for her presentations and answers.

RES. 26/2022 MOVED by Councillor J. Brewin recommends Administration put Amanda Malone on the next available Council Meeting as a Delegation, with the Recreation Board support for Bylaw amendments to be made to allow future horseback riding on the area west of HWY 864 (known as Trout Pond area).

RES. 27/2022 MOVED by D. Hansen that the Recreation Board would also like to recommend that Council directs Administration to create a Board that will take care of the policies, procedures, maintenance, and operations of the Trout Pond trails/park. This Board will consist of representative from each user group that uses the park, one representative from Town of Taber Recreation Board, and one representative from the residence of the M.D. of Taber.
