Emergency Preparedness Tips: Shelter in Place

Every month we've been highlighting a number of emergency preparedness tips and information so you can be prepared for emergencies and hazards that could occur in Taber or area (see previous months at www.taber.ca/cornhusk). This month we'd like to focus on what shelter-in-place may mean in different circumstances.

What is Shelter in Place?

To shelter in place is to protect yourself by finding the safest area near you and putting as much distance and as many barriers between you and the threat as possible. Taking shelter will depend on the kind of hazard being faced and where you are located when it becomes a threat.

⇒ Authorities will issue public notices to shelter in place if it is determined that an outside hazard is a threat to life safety and an evacuation would pose a greater risk.

Plan for different situations. For example, you may be travelling or stuck in traffic, at home with friends and family or at the office away from loved ones. Each situation will require a different approach.

For What Reasons would I Shelter in Place?

 Thunderstorms, tornadoes, and blizzards occur frequently across Alberta. They can be unpredictable, move quickly, and cause widespread devastation. If advised to shelter in place, bring everyone indoors.

How to Shelter in Place: Home

- Bring everyone indoors, including pets (if it is safe).
- If possible, take shelter below ground in a small windowless room in the middle of your home with no exterior doors, like a basement bathroom.
- If a room below ground is not available, take shelter in a small room in the middle of the main floor, such as a bathroom, closet or under a heavy table or stairwell.
- In a multi-level building, take shelter in a hallway, room, or stairwell in the middle of the building; or if available, on the main floor or an underground parking garage.
- In a mobile home or camper, find shelter in a solid building close by; if that is not available, shelter in your vehicle (refer to the "Vehicle" section).
- Gather your emergency supplies in your shelter. Include supplies like water, flashlight, nonperishable snacks, medications and a battery or crank powered radio.

Vehicle

- Close all windows, turn on your headlights and look for a safe location to park.
- Avoid parking near trees, power lines, on bridges or under overpasses due to risk of flooding and high winds.
- Fasten your seatbelt, protect your head and neck and get below the window as much as possible
- Turn on the hazard lights and turn off the engine.
- In extreme cold temperatures, you may need to run the vehicle once in a while to stay warm. Make sure to check that your tail pipe is not blocked and open a window for airflow.
- Do not attempt to drive away or exit your vehicle until you know it is safe. Listen to authorities for direction.

At Work or School

• If advised to shelter in place while at work/school, it is important you refer to your workplace/school emergency response plan as well as your personal emergency plan. If you don't know your employer's/school's response plan, ask them about it.

Outdoors (without shelter)

- Cover your head and neck with your arms to protect yourself from flying debris or hail.
- Go to a low-lying area such as a gutter, ravine, or valley; lie down flat and be ready to move in the case of flooding.
- Avoid places that may attract lightning such as standing water, metal, mobile equipment, power lines and trees.
- Do not shelter under bridges or overpasses due to risk of flooding and high winds.

Pets

- You can help prepare your pets by practicing to shelter in place with them in different locations.
- Bring your pets indoors. Do not chase loose pets as it puts yourself and others at risk.
- Grab your pet's emergency kit if you have one or keep important supplies close to their shelter.
- If possible, bring them into your shelter and avoid letting them roam freely.

Take a few minutes to evaluate your workplace, classroom and other places you visit often to identify spaces that could become a shelter if needed.

It's important to prepare your family and property for emergencies before they occur. Being prepared ahead of time reduces stress and helps keep you safe and ready. For more hazard information and easy steps to take to be more prepared, visit:

Taber Police Service CCTV Security Camera Registry

The purpose of the Registry is to assist the Taber Police Service with investigations where a private security camera(s) may have captured video



evidence. The program allows the registrant to register the existence of their CCTV system.

The goal of the CCTV Camera Registry program is to detect crime and promote public safety through collaboration between the Taber Police Service and the community we serve. Registration in the program is voluntary. Accordingly, all CCTV Camera registrants agree to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The Taber Police Service (TPS) may request access to video footage containing or related to criminal activity, that was collected by the home or business. The owner may decide to disclose the requested video footage to TPS.
- 2. If necessary, the TPS will contact the home or business owner directly, using the information provided upon registration, to request the appropriate CCTV camera footage.
- 3. Under no circumstances shall registrants construe that they are acting as an agent and/or employee of the Town of Taber and/or the TPS through the CCTV Camera Registry program.
- 4. Under no circumstances shall the TPS obtain any information or footage/feeds without the direct assistance from the registrants.
- 5. The provided CCTV footage may be disclosed to the court for any criminal or civil proceedings.

The Taber Police Service does not own any CCTV cameras in the community, but frequently utilizes business and residential CCTV Security systems for its investigations.

We believe the Registry will enhance the ability of the Taber Police Service to solve crimes which occur within our community.


