



PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT:

Wind & Excessive Moisture to Impact Transfer Station

Safety comes first at the Taber Transfer Station for both our citizens and our staff. After taking a look at our safety practices and comparing them to similar transfer stations and landfills in Southern Alberta, the Town is announcing a number of new weather procedures that will impact services at the Transfer Station.

Effective September 1st, 2023, the Transfer Station will be closed for service during the following weather conditions:

- When sustained wind speeds reach 70km/h or higher;
- When persistent wind gusts are 65km/h or higher;
- When a High Wind Advisory or Wind Warning has been issued for Taber by Environment and Climate Change Canada;
- When excessive moisture (rain, snow, flooding, etc.) has impacted the Transfer Station road to such an extent that Town crews are unable to maintain the road for traffic safety.

A weather station will be installed at the Transfer Station that will help our staff determine the wind speeds accurately.

Signage for this new policy will be posted at the Transfer Station gates, and when the Transfer Station has to close, temporary signage stating the same will be posted for users to see. The Town will also post notices on our channels.

The Transfer Station may reopen during business hours if strong wind speeds subside, or road conditions improve. If this is the case, the Town will make this known to the public on our channels.

In case of windy conditions or severely wet weather, we recommend citizens check our channels or call ahead (403-223-5569 or the Shop at 403-223-6018 during regular Town business hours) to determine if the Transfer Station is open before they come to the facility.

We appreciate the public's understanding and cooperation in helping keep our facilities safe.

2023 Municipal By-Election

The Town of Taber Municipal By-Election will be held Thursday, September 7th at the Community Centre Auditorium (4720 50th Street). Polls are open from 10 AM to 8 PM.

The unofficial results will be posted on the Town of Taber official channels (website and social media) after the ballots are counted on election night. Ballots can only be counted AFTER polls close at 8 PM, so stay tuned to our official Town of Taber channels any time after 8 PM on September 7th, as the results will be posted as soon as the count is completed.



It's time to prepare for the 2023 Town of Taber municipal by-election.

Here's what you need to know about identification requirements:

- All voters are required to present one piece of identification in order to vote in the election
- Your ID must have your name and current address on it. Photo ID is not required
- Renters and new Canadian
 Citizens can vote if they are
 eligible and are able to provide
 proper identification
- A letter or form (attestation) from an authorized representative can also be used
- The Town of Taber accepts any ID noted on the Government of Alberta's official listing
- The full list of eligible identification requirements can be found on our website as provided by the Government of Alberta



It's time to prepare for the 2023 Town of Taber municipal by-election.

Here's what you need to know about being eligible to vote:

- You must be at least 18 years old and a Canadian Citizen
- You must be a resident of the Town of Taber on Election Day (Thursday, September 7, 2023)
- You must provide authorized identification at the polls (ID types can be found on our website)
- Renters and new Canadian Citizens are eligible to vote as long as they meet the eligibility
- Landed immigrants and British subjects are not eligible to vote
- All voters must sign the voting register stating they meet these qualifications before being presented a ballot

Emergency Preparedness Tips: Evacuations & Winter Preparedness

This month's emergency preparedness tips are like a double-feature at a movie! September is a unique time in Southern Alberta in terms of hazards. We could experience fires or snowfall; there's no predicting what Mother Nature may do. That's why it's important to be prepared for anything. So in that spirit, we're giving you two different sets of information to help you become better prepared, no matter what happens:

Evacuations

Evacuations have been in the news frequently this year. They can happen at a moment's notice, and sometimes with no notice at all. Do you know what to do during an evacuation? Do you know what you would take?

What is the difference between an Evacuation Alert and an Evacuation Order?

- An Evacuation Alert means that people should be prepared to evacuate soon, if the situation deteriorates.
 Alerts help you prepare to leave on short notice.
 Prepare to go quickly and monitor official sources of information for updates & instructions.
- An Evacuation Order means that people *must* evacuate now. Evacuation Orders are issued when you are in danger. Evacuate immediately if you are located inside an Order's boundaries and directed to evacuate. Delaying your departure can put your life at risk and hinder emergency response efforts. Follow the specific instructions provided by your local authorities during an evacuation.

What Steps Can I take to be Prepared before an Evacuation?

- Prepare an emergency kit with AT LEAST 3 days' worth of supplies (72 hours' worth) for your entire family.
 - ⇒ It is important to note that many evacuations last longer than 3 days, and it is always better to prepare for longer evacuations with more supplies, if you can.
- Have plans for your children and pets, especially if you are not home when an evacuation occurs.
 Communicate your plans to your children (using ageappropriate language) so they are aware.
- Know your insurance policy, and take pictures of your property/belongings in case you need to file a claim.
- Keep cash on hand in case ATMs or banks are closed/ offline.
- Consider keeping a list of must-grab items in your home (important documents, emergency kit, photo albums, etc.) that you can grab with only a few minutes' notice.

- Keep your gas tank close to full by regularly topping up fuel (or charging your electric car battery). If you have to drive elsewhere in an evacuation, gas/charging stations may be busy, out of supplies, or closed.
- If you don't have a vehicle, make a plan with friends or neighbours, or follow the instructions provided in the evacuation alert for those without transportation.
- Keep emergency numbers in your home (hard copy). Consider creating emergency contact cards for each member of your household.

Winter Preparedness

We're sorry—we know most are hoping winter won't arrive for many weeks yet, but Southern Alberta is no stranger to weird weather, including snowfall long before winter officially arrives. While the weather is nicer, it's a great time to get prepared before the first snowflake falls.

Prepare an Emergency Kit for your Car (checklist):

- ⇒ Food that won't spoil (energy bars, etc.)
- ⇒ Water– plastic bottles that won't break if frozen
- \Rightarrow Blanket(s)
- ⇒Extra clothing and shoes/boots
- ⇒ First aid kit with seatbelt cutter
- ⇒ Small shovel, scraper, and snow brush
- ⇒ Candle in a deep can and matches
- ⇒ Wind-up flashlight
- ⇒ Whistle (in case you need to attract attention)
- \Rightarrow Roadmaps
- ⇒ Copy of your emergency plan

Items to Keep in your Trunk:

- ⇒ Sand, salt, or cat litter (non-clumping)
- ⇒ Antifreeze and windshield washer fluid
- \Rightarrow Tow rope
- ⇒ Jumper cables
- ⇒ Fire extinguisher
- ⇒ Warning light or road flares

Print or download the above Emergency Car Kit lists. Cross items off the list as you put them in your car.

It's important to prepare your family and property for emergencies before they occur. Being prepared ahead of time reduces stress and helps keep you safe and ready. For more hazard information and easy steps to


