Emergency Preparedness Tips: Tech & More Wildfire Tips

In our January edition, we shared some tips on how to be prepared before a wildfire. This time, we're sharing more on how to be prepared if a wildfire occurs (the official Wildfire Season in Alberta starts March 1st). As an added bonus, we've included some great technology tips as well.

During a Wildfire:

If a wildfire occurs, you may or may not have notice to evacuate. It is vital that you are prepared **BEFORE** a wildfire occurs, as they can be unpredictable and fast, and you may not be at home to gather items if you have to evacuate immediately.

Prepare to Leave

If there is a threat of fire in your area:

- Listen to updates provided by official channels (Town of Taber channels and/or Alberta Emergency Alert).
- Be prepared to evacuate at a moment's notice.
- Have your vehicle stocked with supplies and ready to go (including fueled/charged car).

Safeguard Pets (and Livestock, if applicable)

- Bring your pets indoors and move grazing animals to a central, safe refuge.
- Avoid locking farm animals in enclosures such as barns as they could get trapped.

Safety First

Wildfires are extremely dangerous. If a wildfire enters your community, the following steps can help.

- Report it and get to a safe place. Never attempt to fight a fire yourself.
- Smoke from wildfires can be harmful. Children, the elderly, and those with heart and lung related health issues are at the greatest risk from smoke inhalation. Paper masks do not provide protection from smoke.
- Ensure all windows & doors are closed. Cover vents and other openings with duct tape or other adhesive to keep smoke out.

Evacuation Alerts & Orders: What's the Difference?

Evacuation alert (advisory): People should prepare to evacuate soon, if the situation deteriorates.

- Evacuation alerts help you prepare to leave on short notice.
- Take the actions directed, be prepared to go quickly and monitor official sources of information for updates.

Evacuation order (critical): People must evacuate now.

- Evacuation orders are issued when you are in danger.
- Emergency situations can change rapidly and prompt an immediate evacuation order.
- Evacuate **immediately** if you are located inside an order's boundaries and directed to evacuate.
- Delaying your departure can put your life at risk and hinder emergency response efforts.
- Follow the specific instructions provided by your local authorities during an evacuation.
- Always prioritize your safety and the safety of those around you.
- If you are ordered to evacuate, you cannot return to your community until authorities have declared it safe to do so.

Technology Emergency Preparedness Tips

We rely on technology more & more in our everyday lives, but what happens in the event of a major emergency? Here are tips on the use of technology during an emergency:

- If possible, use non-voice channels like text messaging, email or social media. These use less bandwidth than voice communications and may work even when phone service doesn't.
- If you must use a phone, keep your conversation brief and convey only vital information to emergency personnel and/or family.
- Unable to complete a call? Wait 10 seconds before redialing to help reduce network congestion. Cordless phones rely on electricity and will not work during a power outage. If you have a landline, keep at least one corded phone in your home.
- Keep a charger for your mobile device in your emergency kit. Consider getting a solar-powered, crank, or vehicle phone charger. If you don't have a cell phone, keep a prepaid phone card in your emergency kit.
- Keep your contacts updated on your phone, email and other channels. This will make it easier to reach important contacts.
- If you have a smartphone, save your safe meeting location(s) on its mapping application.
- Conserve your smartphone's battery by reducing the screen's brightness, placing your phone in airplane mode, and closing apps you are not using. You never know how long a power outage will last!


