Be Prepared. Know Your Risks: Emergency Preparedness Week is May 5th to 11th!

In the Government of Alberta's annual <u>Preparedness Survey of Albertans</u>, most respondents said that the biggest reasons they are not prepared for emergencies is due to a lack of information, lack of money, and procrastination. 45% of respondents feel unprepared for an emergency, but 85% are concerned about the impact of extreme weather.

The top four hazards Albertans are concerned about (according to the survey) are:

- Extreme cold/winter storms
- Power/water outages
- Wildfires
- Extreme heat.

Southern Albertans specifically indicated extreme heat and severe drought were their top hazard concerns.

Disasters impact people first. They start in our communities. In people's homes and places of work. The first call for help goes to municipal services, and then as the situation becomes more severe, different orders of government come to help. As more control of the situation occurs, the layers of government that stepped in to help, begin to step back until it returns to where it started, at the individual level.

Because of this, the Town of Taber wanted to share some more quick tips this month so everyone can get started on getting prepared. While we share information on preparedness and hazards every month (and many tips on our social media channels), our info this month include the most basic FAQs & tips so everyone has a place to start in getting prepared for an emergency.

Even taking a few minutes each week or a few hours per month will make you more prepared, and therefore more comfortable when an emergency happens. More resources and info is available at www.alberta.ca/BePrepared

Remember, it's not *if* an emergency will happen, but *when & where*. The more prepared you are, the better off you will be handling the situation when it happens. *Don't be scared, be prepared.*

Emergency FAQ Quick List

We've rounded up some of the most frequently asked questions surrounding emergencies & preparedness. Check them out below:

What's the difference between a disaster and an emergency?

An **emergency** is a situation that requires a speedy response to save lives and protect property. These are events that first responders such as firefighters, police, and paramedics will respond to on a regular basis, such an auto collision, robbery, or residential fire. Disasters are much more serious events and threaten or cause widespread losses and damage. **Disasters** will disrupt everyday life and essential functions. Examples of disasters could be flash floods in an urban area, a tornado in a populated area, or a long power outage in the middle of winter.

What is the difference between an Evacuation Alert versus an Evacuation Order?

Evacuation Alerts (sometimes called Advisories) mean people should prepare to evacuate soon, if the situation deteriorates. Evacuation alerts help you to prepare to leave on short notice. Be prepared to go quickly. Evacuation Orders are critical and mean people must evacuate now. They are issued when you are in danger, and delaying your departure can put your life at risk and hinder emergency response efforts.

During an Emergency, where will I find information?

In emergencies, prioritize official sources for reliable information. While updates from the Town of Taber might take time, emergency teams work as fast as possible behind-the-scenes to provide verified details as quickly as they can get them to the public. Key Town sources include:

Cross-check information from unofficial channels (social media groups, rumors, other pages) to official Town sources. Misinformation can obstruct emergency efforts, delay critical updates, or risk lives and property. When unsure, trust and share only from official Town of Taber channels.

How long do evacuations typically last?

It depends on the emergency. Some emergency evacuations last longer than others (hours, days, or even weeks). As we saw with the 2023 Alberta Wildfires, some evacuations can last longer than a week, and sometimes there's even a chance you could be re-evacuated after reentry if the danger reoccurs. It is important you are prepared for at least 72 hours, but if you can prepare for longer, that is also strongly encouraged. 72 hours is only a minimum standard.

Free/Low Cost Actions to be More Prepared:

- Have a conversation with your family, children, and friends on your emergency/evacuation plans (where you will go, what you would take, what happens if someone is at school/work, etc.).
- **Read your insurance policies** (home, car, other property). Know what the policies cover & what they don't.
- Prepare a detailed list of all of your belongings (include pictures). This is helpful for insurance purposes, and is called a "Home Inventory."
- Starting your preparedness kit doesn't have to be expensive! Items from places like the dollar store are great for emergency kits. When buying groceries, consider adding extra non-perishables on sale to your list to add to your kit. Start building your kit slowly over time— even a little bit helps!
- **Photocopy important documents** and keep them in a secure location. ID cards, insurance documents, financial papers, etc.

May is the Start of Tornado Season in Alberta

May through September is tornado and hail season, with mid-June to early August being the peak time (though they can occur any time during the year). Tornadoes are often hard to see from far away and not all have a visible funnel cloud. Tornadoes usually come from the south or west, but can quickly changes direction without warning. Most develop in the late afternoon and early evening.

Safety Tips:

- Get down, protect your head and watch out for flying debris
- Do not chase tornadoes. They are unpredictable and can change course abruptly.
- A tornado is deceptive, it may appear to be standing still when it is moving toward you.
- Keep your radio on to find out what areas are affected, what roads are safe, where to go, and what to do if you have been directed to evacuate.
- Keep your emergency kit close by.
- Follow instructions from authorities. Remember, disobeying an order puts lives at risk.

GARDEN WATER CONSERVATION TIPS:

- Collect rainwater in a barrel for plant watering
- Use a watering can instead of a hose
- Choose drought-resistant plants
- Limit lawn watering (and follow any restrictions)
- · Reuse aquarium water for plants
- Mulch your garden to limit water needs
- Use a soil moisture meter
- · Group plants by water needs
- Check for hidden leaks

HOME MAINTENANCE WATER CONSERVATION TIPS:

- Insulate water pipes to reduce heat loss & reduce water waste waiting for hot water
 Install hot water recirculation numps for faster hot
- Install hot water recirculation pumps for faster hot water access
- Regularly check for leaks in all plumbing
- Select water-efficient appliances
- Conduct a home Water Audit




WATER SAVING TIP
