Canada Day Notes

Regarding the water fight during Canada Day:

The Town of Taber understands we may be facing drought conditions in July. We have accounted for the use of the water during this particular activity by reducing our irrigation usage elsewhere, not using the large hose on the fire truck during the water fight this year, and using a large bladder container of water to limit the amount of water used (instead of running a hydrant/tap for long periods of time). We want to balance responsible water usage with allowing a few hours of fun, and believe our conservation efforts elsewhere make it so we can balance both. We appreciate the public's understanding.

Regarding Fireworks:

The 10:45 PM timing for fireworks is approximate due to sunset timing. Fireworks are also weather & wind dependent. If the fireworks take place, they will be viewable from Confederation Park. If they are cancelled due to weather/wind, we will notify the public on our official Town of Taber Facebook page:

WATER SAVING TIP

Adjust your lawn mower. A taller lawn will shade plant roots and, as a result, hold soil moisture better than grass that's been closely clipped. Keep your blades at least three inches tall in the growing season, and cut them shorter in the fall to promote fresh growth.

Watering of lawns, gardens, trees, and shrubs may only occur during the following hours:

6:00 AM - 9:00 AM or 7:00 PM - 10:00 PM on prescribed days

All other outdoor water use is permitted any time on your prescribed days. This includes filling of pools, hot tubs, vehicle washing, filling of ponds/fountains, washing house exteriors, etc.

Despite the recent rain the town has received in the past few weeks, the Town of Taber is still under Level I Water Restrictions (as of writing this newsletter—subject to changes at any time).

This is because the Provincial Government has asked all small water license holders (which the municipality is one of) to reduce our water consumption by 5-10% this year. By reducing our own municipal water usage (irrigation, spray park hours reduction, etc.) and enacting our lowest level of water restrictions, this will help us meet that target. By reducing our water usage now, we are preparing for warmer and drier weather that is expected to occur later this summer. That being said, the Town is constantly evaluating our water usage numbers and listening to feedback from the Province and our Irrigation Districts so we can adjust water usage and rules when needed.

We sincerely appreciate the public's cooperation and understanding as we work through the drought conditions the entire province is facing.

Emergency Preparedness: Your Emergency Plan

The current wildfire conditions in Alberta are a good reminder to review, practice and update your emergency plan with your household so everyone knows what to do if a wildfire – or any other hazard - threatens your home or community.

Improve your readiness by:

- Determining safe exits from your home and neighbourhood. Download the 511Alberta app to access current road conditions.
- Deciding with your household on a shared meeting place outside of your community and ensure it is pet friendly (if applicable).
- Designating a person to pick up your children or pets if you are unavailable.
- Creating a list of things you cannot live without. Critical thinking during a time of stress is challenging. Having a list that you follow to quickly grab and go will help.

Make Preparedness Habits:

The Preparedness Survey of Albertans confirms 45% of respondents feel unprepared. Here are some tips to help you make preparedness a habit:

- Buy a case of water on your next trip to the grocery store.
- Keep your phone charged by carrying a phone charger with you.
- When you can, consider setting aside \$5 a month to go towards an emergency savings account. Every dollar counts.

Mental Health & Emergencies:

Taking care of your mental health will help you navigate unexpected situations more easily when they occur. Emergencies can take a toll on your mental health. Tips:

- Practice coping and wellness actions to improve your ability to think clearly, make informed decisions and know when to ask for help.
- Build stronger connections with those around you. Support systems are essential to individuals wellbeing.
