






WATER SAVING TIP #28



Emergency Preparedness: Preparing for Winter

We know winter is the last thing on your mind right now, but snow and cold can come as early as September in rare instances in the south. It's always best to be prepared as we head into the last four months of the year. Prepare now while it is warm, so you don't have to rush or worry when the frost, snow, or cold comes!

Prepare your Home

- Prepare your home for winter temperatures by doing regular maintenance before cold weather starts. Make sure your heating system is working efficiently, that your chimney is clean and ready for use, and that any cracks and drafts are sealed to keep the heat inside
- Check on older adult relatives and neighbours to ensure they are warm enough and have sufficient supplies, particularly when the weather is cold or snowy. They may not be able to safely go outside to shop and may require food, medications and other supplies to prepare
- Consider installing a backup heat source that can be used in case of a power outage, such as a fireplace that does not require power to operate the exhaust system or a generator that can be used to power an electric space heater or run existing electric heating appliances
- Install certified carbon monoxide alarms with battery backup in hallways, outside of sleeping areas.

Prepare your Vehicle

- Get an emergency kit for your car, including winter supplies such as extra blankets and jumper cables
- Make sure to keep your gas tank full when periods of extreme cold are forecast
- Install winter tires on your vehicle.
- Learn more about how to prepare your vehicle for cold weather winter driving:

\Rightarrow Battery

- ⇒ Making sure the motor is in good working order. Motors need a fully charged battery to start in cold weather
- ⇒ Cleaning the battery posts and checking the charging system and belts
- ⇒ Replacing weak batteries before they fail

\Rightarrow Lights

- ⇒ Making sure that all lights work and that the headlights are adjusted properly
- ⇒ Making sure that the headlights are in the proper position. Many new vehicles aim headlights automatically, so they need to be inspected by a professional to ensure they're in the right position

\Rightarrow Brakes

⇒ Doing a thorough brake check to make sure they're in top working condition. Pulling, a change in pedal feel, or unusual squealing or grinding may mean that the brakes need repair

⇒ Exhaust system

⇒ Checking for leaks that could send deadly carbon monoxide into the vehicle

⇒ Heating and cooling system

- ⇒ Checking the radiator hoses and drive belts for cracks and leaks
- ⇒ Making sure the radiator cap,

- water pump, and thermostat work properly
- ⇒ Testing the strength and level of the coolant/anti-freeze, and making sure the heater and defroster work well

⇒ Windshield wipers

- ⇒ Making sure that wipers are in good condition and replace blades that streak
- ⇒ Using wipers designed for winter
- ⇒ Filling up on winter washer fluid in the -40°C temperature range and carry an extra jug in the vehicle

⇒ Tires

- ⇒ Making sure the tires are at the correct pressure
- ⇒ Making sure winter tires have at least 4mm tread depth for the safest winter driving.

Financial Preparedness

- Speak to an insurance agent about your specific needs.
- Know your insurance policy.
 Make sure your home, vehicle, business and belongings are protected.
- If possible, consider an emergency savings account to cover temporary expenses while you are out of your home (if evacuated or in case there is damage to your home).
- If you can, keep emergency cash handy in case banking services are unavailable.
- If you are evacuated, keep all receipts for additional expenses.
- Prepare a detailed list of all your belongings.
