





CALL TO ORDER

Luke Wijna called the Regular Meeting of the Taber Recreation Board to order at 5:15 pm

BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

A) Sponsorship Update

A. Holmen explained Town Council's decision to accept the first portion on the Sponsorship Group's proposal being Asset identification and valuation. Council will then review the findings prior to making a decision to move onto the "Selling of Sponsorship" portion. Once the Agreement is signed both parties will move forward.

A) Southern Alberta Recreation Association

A. Holmen reported that the 2012 Southern Alberta Games would be held in Raymond and that the Southern Alberta Recreation Association was still looking for a host Community for 2013 games. The SARA board is looking at opportunities to align/partner with Alberta Games to help share the cost on signage, website strategies, etc. These may keep the cost down for future host communities.

It was brought up that SARA should consider tightening up the age brackets for the older age categories in the sports to allow for fairer competition and possibly getting more participating. These individuals are there watching maybe they will participate. A. Holmen explained that this has been looked at for some sports, but some of the categories are consistent with the sports provincial governing bodies. However, she agreed to bring the concern forth to the next meeting so it can be reviewed again.

2012 Budget Recreation/Leisure Services Backgrounder


The Municipal Government Act in the Province of Alberta clearly outlines the purposes of a municipality. Municipalities are to provide good government, to provide services, facilities or other things that, in the opinion of Council, are necessary or desirable for all or a part of the municipality, in developing and maintaining safe and viable communities.



Revised Statutes of Alberta 2000 Chaoser M-26

In order for a municipality to sustain itself and grow, Council must consider a variety of programs and services that are delivered in many different formats with each program and service having value to the citizens of the Town.

Some programs and services are utilized daily by the vast majority of the community (roads,



utilities); other programs and services are utilized by specific groups or individuals (such as recreation facilities and the library), while other programs and services are used on an as-needed basis, (such as fire, ambulance and police services). The Town delivers these programs and services using its own resources for the most part, supplemented with non-profit organizations like the Taber Library Board and the Taber Handibus

Association.


Each year, Council is required to pass a budget which reflects the current year operating revenues and expenditures as well as a capital budget for infrastructure maintenance, replacement and improvements. The budget can be a direct correlation with service delivery for all the programs and services the Town provides. As part of the budget process, Administration continues to reference best practices to deliver efficiencies in the operations. Efficiencies can be achieved by eliminating processes, adapting existing service delivery models, introducing new technology and identifying/eliminating duplications of services. The attached request for decision document provides Council and the taxpayers of Taber details on the 2011 operating and capital budget.



The 2012 budget reflects a fiscally conservative approach, based on the growing infrastructure deficit that draws upon the majority of our revenue sources including senior government grants, municipal reserves, property tax and user fees, enabling the municipality to address the highest priority items. Council recognizes both the operational needs and capital replacement requirements and as the Town moves forward with major capital infrastructure needs, new funding sources will be required to meet those demands.

The 2012 operating budget generally reflects maintaining existing

municipal service levels. The Town anticipates undertaking a thorough review of its municipal programs & services in 2012 as it balances the demands for those programs & services with the ever-increasing challenge of sustainable funding.



The 2012 Operating budget for Recreation includes the following highlights:

Revenues

A. Recreation & Leisure Services User Fees – no change to auditorium, summer programs & special event user fees in 2012; 3% increase to aquatics, arenas, sportsfields & cemetery fees

Expenditures

- A. Facility & Equipment Maintenance Lifecycle Program our preliminary operating budget reflected fully funding and implementing the program, however the final 2012 budget reflects the same level of funding as was approved in 2011. The impact of this is deferral of some costs to future years to maintain & replace equipment, and the continuing risk of building and equipment failures and emergency shutdown, repairs and additional costs. Such an example is duct cleaning in the facilities has been removed.
- B. Staffing levels one full-time permanent position have been removed from the original proposed 2012 budget, as has approximately \$70,000 in wages in the aquatics function. As such, the Town has frozen staffing to the same level as 2011. Due to the approval of

- more efficient equipment for sportsfields in the capital budget there will be a reduction of three seasonal positions in that function.
- C. Staff training and development a small increase to provide additional required staff training and development allowing for our valued employees to perform their duties/responsibilities and effectively serve our ratepayers & residents.
- D. There is limited contingency incorporated into the budget for unexpected expenditures.
- E. Recreation Sponsorship Program In November 2011, Council authorized this new program as recommended by the Recreation Board, in an effort to generate new operating revenues to offset increasing operating expenditures. The budget plan reflects new operating revenues coming to fruition beginning in 2014.
- F. Arena includes replacement of pressure relief header and re-build of compressors in plant room. Large ice arena dressing room flooring, spectator net replacement and interior/exterior painting are no longer in the budget for 2012.
- G. Auditorium Items no longer in the operating budget include interior painting, front entrance flooring, bar renovations, and storage renovations.

Highlights of the 2012 Capital budget include:

- A. Aquafun Centre upgrades upgrades to the facility to include replacement of pvc pool liner.
- B. Cemetery purchase of a zero turn mower for more effective operations.
- C. Sportsfields irrigation renovations will be completed in the area near the entrance to the facility where previously the berm was situated. Irrigation will also be installed in the area of the tree nursery. Upgrades to the drainage systems at the oval are no longer included in the capital plan. Although the Recreation Board recommended that all three washrooms be installed in 2013 for the various locations only \$100,000 has been approved for construction in 2013. Purchase of self propelled large mower to improve efficiency of mowing.
- D. Arena small ice arena floor/board replacement project is no longer included in the capital budget.
- E. Pedestrian Trail the next phase of trail construction will begin in 2012 extending sting trail system beyond KMMSF.

A. BIDDING INFORMATION

- 1. All bids should be directed toward the Planning and Administration Committee Chairman.
- 2. Sport Selection Criteria
 - a. The host Community must host all of the core sports plus optional sports to a minimum of 12.
 - b. Core sports are those that continue to exhibit high athlete and spectator participation.
 - c. Only optional sports may be added or deleted with the authorization of the Planning & Administration Committee.

- 4. Bids should be submitted in written form including
 - a. Statements of desire by the municipality to host the Games.
 - b. Statements regarding sports which the community would like to host as outline in 2 and 3.

- c. Facilities to be used for the sports.
- d. Dates for the Games to be determined between the Host Community and the Southern Alberta Recreation Association.
- e. Statements, which would indicate names of people in the community who are qualified and might consider chairing committees for:
 - Games Chairman
 - Publicity
 - Medical
 - Social Events
 - Medals
 - Communications
 - Sports Facilities
 - Sports
- 5. The Southern Alberta Recreation Association has a grant available for the host community.
- 6. Any community bidding on the Southern Alberta Summer Games, that has hosted the Games in the last eight years, their bid will be secondary to new communities.
- 7. The successful bid will be announced at the Opening Ceremonies of the Games.
- 8. The successful community will be required to provide sufficient liability insurance and will be required to sign a letter of agreement with the Southern Alberta Recreation Association. (Copy follows criteria)
