The Use of Force report for 2014 has been completed. The report for 2014 totalled 14 incidents. There were no injuries requiring treatment to either the police or the offender. Officers drew but did not discharge their sidearm on three occasions and the Taser was deployed on three occasions but only fired on one. Each of the 14 instances was reviewed against a set of Provincial Guidelines and there were no trends or concerns identified, members of the TPS acted accordingly within the law.
