Aspects of the proposed roster operations that affect and are important to public complainants will be raised by public complaint directors present. This opportunity for dialogue will greatly assist Alberta Justice and Solicitor General in delivering a specialized roster of mediators with clear deliverables allowing for the standardized delivery of consistent and quality mediation services to public complainants, police officers, police services and oversight bodies.

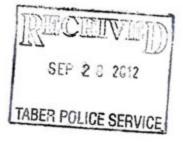
