

The report is broken into our three functions of police, dispatch and the Community Standards Unit, followed by a section on budget, police complaints, crime analyses, etc., strategic planning, and other. In each of these functions, there is information for you. Some of the slots may be empty, but next month perhaps not.

Police

Community Involvement:

- Chief Abela and RSM Cst. Nguyen marched with the Taber Fire Department and the Mayor to celebrate the 100th year birthday of a veteran living in Taber.
- Chief Abela has been accepted as a Fellow at the Canadian Police College and will be assisting in the learning of 14 senior police leaders in Canada through within the Executive Development Program.

Training:

The auxiliary constables will undergo PPCT, pepper spray and baton training in April.

Equipment:

- In March, three of our capital projects were completed. The carpet and flooring have been
 replaced in the dispatch area, constables work area, hallways, VSU office etc. We also
 completed the key less entry and controlled access project and upgraded the constables work
 desks to be Covid complaint and more ergonomic and user friendly.
- Commission is already aware that we have a request into Council for a capital purchase to
 obtain end points and licensing for our Avtech radio console, and to purchase a second console
 at the second dispatch pod and the applicable software licencing. This purchase will allow us to
 reach into more of Alberta to provide dispatch services to municipalities requiring assistance
 with their CPO programs.

 We have interviewed three potential police applicants. Thank you to Chair Sorensen for helping with the interviews.

- Cst. Mark Valgardson has resigned form the Taber Police Service effective April 30. We would like top to thank him for his service to our community. He is an excellent police officer and we wish him the best as he transitions into a non police role in our community.
- Our summer student postings have been put out.

Policy:

• The Council asked for the new Dog Bylaw to go to public consultations. A plan was created and sent to Council April 12 for consideration. If approved, we will be creating a survey for the community to take and the results provided to TOT admin for their consideration.

• We are investigating the purchase of a second console system to obtain better technology in the second dispatch pod.

Personnel:

- We have interviewed for the summer student position.
- We have also posted for a casual position in dispatch.
- One full time staff member has requested a leave of absence and it was granted.

Report for March, 2021

Community Standards Unit Monthly Report- March, 2021

During the month of March, 2021, there were 23 Bylaw related calls for service. These 23 calls included seven dog related calls, two nuisance property related calls, four animal wellbeing calls, one dumping call, and the remaining involved calls for found bikes, skunk traps and public assistance.

Of the seven dog related calls three were regarding dogs running at large. All dogs were returned to their owners. One dog was found at large by an officer and was later returned to the owner. Four of the calls were regarding barking dogs. The owners of the dogs were spoken with on each occasion and were warned to keep it from happening in the future.

Of the four animal wellbeing calls that came in, one was regarding an injured deer near the edge of town that made its way out into the MD south of town. Two of these calls were in involving concerns of dogs not being taken care of. Both homes were inspected and the dogs seemed to be healthy and in good living conditions with adequate food and water. The last animal wellbeing call was in regards to a dog that got away from the owner and later got sick. The owner then had been informed by the vet it had been poisoned by either antifreeze or some sort of rat poison. The dog survived and upon further investigation there was found a bag of empty antifreeze containers stored within the property of where the dog was found. Investigation did not find any intent to harm any animals by the owner of the property.

In total three traps were lent out and two skunks were caught and released into the MD.

The one public assistance call was involving a round private waste bin that had blown in front of a vehicle and the owner of the vehicle could not exit his house in the high winds to remove it from his vehicle. The bin was moved away and off of the complainant's vehicle.

The one dumping call was involving dumping occurring at the MCC thrift store. It was unable to be determined who had discarded the items in the alley and the situation was remedied by a work order being sent to the town for public works to pick up the items.

Both calls that were relating to the nuisance bylaw were remedied by issuing notices to the properties. Both notices were complied by the property owners.

A total of 12 notices were issued in the month of March for garbage bags to be cleaned up, scrap wood and lumber to be removed and to properly dispose of other litter and discarded items. All notices were complied with by the property owners
